

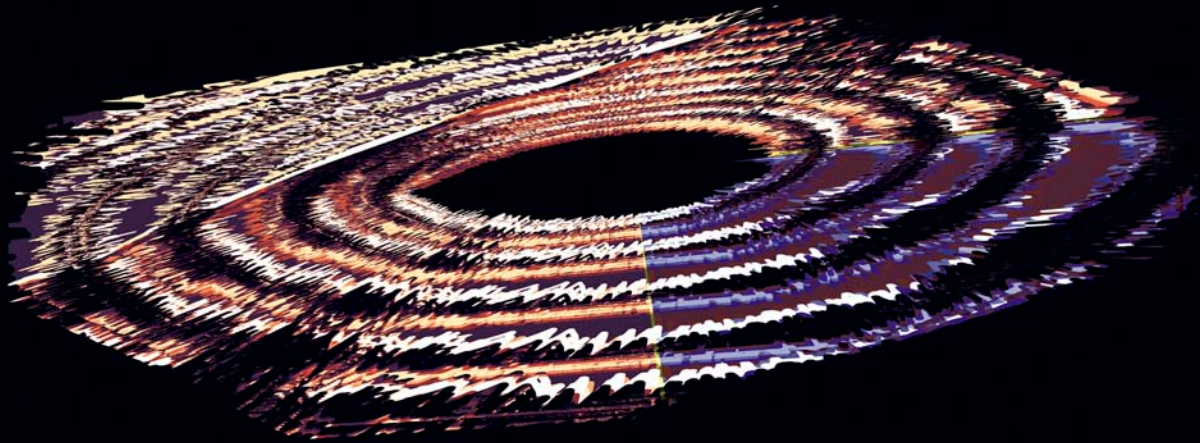

Narrative, Memory, Materiality: Women's Sense of the Past

This course will consider certain theoretical issues concerning women's sense of the past in different cultural and social milieus. It will focus on various concepts (reparation, caring, abject, ambiguity, empathy, emotive knowledge, standpoint theory), that female scholars have used while building their theory of knowledge. Among the topics to be studied will be the past as approached through written stories and material objects. The politics of the past will be discussed within the frameworks of such themes as subjectivity, identity and the human body. Readings will include, among others, works by Braidotti, Cixous, Harding, Klein, Kristeva, Meskill.
